Your Museum continues to see progress with NEW components, numerous suggestions and maintenance/

upgrade of the existing systems.

TOM ROBBINS, RICH FOSKEY and ED MARTIN installed the newly acquired bronze plaque (produced by ROGERS SIGN, MILTON, DE) on a handsome pedestal in the helicopter display area.

The 2020 "Clean-Up" mission was accomplished by 20-volunteers who performed 140+ hours of work March 12-14. A multitude of tasks were completed: cleaning of inside displays, windows, brass fixtures, staining and polishing of doors, conference tables, other furniture, weeding, edging and mulch of the Electronic Messaging Sign bed, flag pole bed, installation of LED lighting in mechanical rooms and in "test" areas around the Museum. Thank you ALL for your efforts.

RICH is coordinating the LED electrical work upgrade with BILL BRYSON (Ret. DSP LT), TOM MACLEISH (Ret. DSP Col.), BAYSIDE ELECTRIC and DOVER ELECTRIC. The main floor displays were prepared by Rich, Ed, Bill and Tom on March 26-27. We know from the outstanding "test" LED lighting installed that the product is a large step forward. The Museum will see efficiencies in reduced energy costs, elimination of damaging Ultraviolet (UV) light (a huge problem with the existing fluorescent-tube fixtures) to both humans and artifacts. BOB HAWKINS and SON, LLC, removed six dead and diseased trees, a large improvement. PROCUT, Inc., Dover, removed one large, diseased tree. Shrubbery is to be removed by HAWKINS and new shrubs installed, beds cleaned, fabric and edging installed by JIM DENHAM and Son, LLC in early April. Volunteers will supplement the project. INTERESTED MEMBERS can contact RICH or ED.

Scheduled projects:

Concrete walkways, curbing and associated parcels are scheduled (date TBD) in April-May by BRICK DOCTOR (Masonry), to also be supplemented with Volunteers.

Powerwashing: Sidewalks, building exterior brick and trim

Decorative "columns" outside the building at entries and front, to be repaired and painted (pending and looking for HELP).

Interior painting - walls and trim (pending and looking for HELP)

Replacement of carpet in Annex main floor with laminate floor product (pending -RICH FOSKEY)

Clean exterior windows (pending and looking for HELP)
